

# How to Access your Form I-94 Online

Every time international students travel to the United States, they are issued an electronic Form I-94 or “Arrival/Departure Record,” at their port of entry. The I-94 is an important document which records the date and purpose of your entry to the US, and how long you are allowed to stay.

Visit the option “Get Most Recent I-94”, agree to the Terms of Service listed on the pop-up page by clicking on “I ACKNOWLEDGE AND AGREE”
