Demographics


- 747 student respondents with representation from all 31 academic departments
- **218 employee respondents**

Awareness of UWRF Sustainability Initiatives

- 96% of employees and 82% of students have heard the term "sustainability" used at UWRF
- 64% of employees feel their work on campus includes or relates to sustainability topics
- 62% of students feel their field of study includes sustainability related topics
- 97% of employees and 90% of students are extremely interested or somewhat interested in sustainability





31% support \$5-\$9 per semester.


19% support \$1-\$4 per semester.

17% are not supportive.


Sustainability Values, Behaviors, & Beliefs

70% of employees and 71% of students understand that sustainability should focus on social, environmental, and economic impacts.


Percent of survey respondents who believe climate change is a very serious or somewhat serious global problem:
