



Residence Life Guest Policy

Guests

“Guest” is defined as any person in a residence hall student room who is not assigned by Residence Life to live in the room, or any person who is not assigned to live in the building.

Resident Hosting Responsibilities

It is the hosting resident’s responsibility to inform guests of the policies and procedures of UW-River Falls. The host resident is responsible for and will be held accountable for the behavior of their guest(s). Guests must always be escorted by the hosting resident and must not be left unattended in the residence hall.

Guest Behavior

Guests must always have a valid photo ID on them and are expected to abide by all residence hall policies. University personnel reserve the right to direct guests to leave the residence hall if they are creating a disturbance within the community. Guests who are violating the law will be required to leave immediately.

Guest Limits/ Restrictions

The number of people in a double room should not exceed eight during the day and four overnights (including residents of the room). In George R. Field South Fork Suites and the Prucha Hall Quads, the number of people should not exceed 10 during the day and eight overnight (including residents of the suite). For extended housing study lounges, the number of people should not exceed 10 (including residents of the space).

Overnight Guests

Overnight guests may be allowed to stay, with permission of a roommate, a maximum of three nights in a row, no more than eight nights per month. All overnight guests under the age of 18 years old must possess written permission from a parent or guardian to stay on campus. The written permission must specifically name the host, host’s address, and parent or guardian contact information.
